Thesis/Dissertation Writing Guidelines of Allied & Paramedical Education

Dissertation is mandatory in Post-graduate subjects under Allied & Health Care Sciences. Each year of study is divided into two semesters of six month duration each; in which last semester of the final year or final Semester of study is exclusively for Dissertation work. However, activities of the Dissertation work should start in the beginning of the 1st month of the Final year.

Time line

The activities for Dissertation in the *Final year* should be followed in the following manner:

Month 1: Submission of Concept Proposal (Synopsis) to the Department Research Committee (DRC)

Month 2: Submission of DRC Approved Concept Proposal (Synopsis) to the University for Approval by the Academic Committee of the University

Month 3: Approval/ Suggested Modifications of the Concept Proposal (Synopsis) by the University

Month 4: Final Approval of the Concept Proposal (Synopsis) by the University.

Month 7: Commencement of Dissertation Work

Month 10: Submission of Dissertation approved by the DRC to the University
